SUBJECT: FAILURE TO APPLY FOR TUVALU CREW ENDORSEMENTS IN ACCORDANCE TO STCW REG I/10

DEFINITIONS:

- "COC" Certificate of Competency in accordance to the STCW
- "COE" Certificate of Endorsement (issued against an officer's COC / GOC / DCE / SSO)
- "DCE" Dangerous Cargo Endorsement (e.g. Advance Oil/Chemical Tanker Certificate)
- "GOC" GMDSS Operator Certificate
- "MSMC" Minimum Safe Manning Certificate
- "PCOE" Provisional COE
- "PSC" Port State Control
- "PSCO" Port State Control Officer
- "SSO" Ship Security Officer Certificate
- "STCW" International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, 1978, as amended

The following terms shall mean:

"Administration" shall mean the Tuvalu Ship Registry.

PURPOSE:

This Marine Circular serves to inform ship owners / operators that all Tuvalu-flagged vessels that have STCW certificated officers serving on board including those beyond and above what is stipulated on the MSMC shall hold either PCOE or COE prior to obtaining Permanent Registration through the submission of a Crew List for the Administration to verify that all applicable crew hold PCOE/COE.

APPLICATION:

This Marine Circular applies to all ship officers and radio operators issued with COC / DCE / GOC / SSO by other STCW member States serving on board Tuvalu flagged vessels.

CONTENTS:

This Administration firmly believes that the lack of PCOE/COE for officers serving on Tuvalu-flagged vessels, which may lead to PSC detention and compromise the safety of the vessel and the marine environment, as something that is unacceptable and completely avoidable. As such, please be reminded of the following:

1. STCW Requirements

- 1.1. All officers including radio operators serving on board Tuvalu ships regardless of the vessel's operational status (unless prior exemption / dispensation has been granted) shall be required to have their COC / DCE / GOC / SSO endorsed by Tuvalu.
- 1.2. This Administration shall recognise the COC / DCE / GOC / SSO issued by a STCW member State through the issuance of a Tuvalu COE.
- 1.3. All officers and radio operators are to ensure that their original COC / DCE / GOC / SSO and accompanying COE are with them when they embark on board the vessel without fail.
- 1.4. All officers and radio operators shall to the best of their ability ensure that their COC / DCE / GOC / SSO and corresponding COE remain valid for the duration of their intended service on board a Tuvalu flagged vessel.
- 1.5. Due to the time required for the Administration to process and issue the original COE, the Administration shall issue a PCOE (valid for 3 months) upon receipt of a COE application in order to allow an officer or radio operator to serve on board a Tuvalu flagged vessel while waiting for the issuance of the Tuvalu COE.
- 1.6. A copy of the PCOE/COE may be either printed or saved in its electronic form and ready to be presented to any requesting authority together with his/her original COC / DCE / GOC / SSO.
- 1.7. Please refer to RC-5/2012/1 for the procedures for application of Tuvalu COE.
- 2. Penalty Imposed on Failure to Comply with STCW I/10
 - 2.1. Should a Tuvalu flagged vessel be detained by a PSC authority for failure to comply with STCW I/10 based on the instructions provided above, then the Administration may impose a penalty of no less than US\$ 5,000 on the ship owner / ship operator / ship manager responsible.
 - 2.2. This Administration believes that good management shall easily avoid any failure to comply with STCW I/10 and so long as the vessel has all the proper crew documentation on board, there should be no need for ship owner / operators to be concerned of the penalty.
